IS THIS TRIP RIGHT FOR YOU?

• Before booking this trip we recommend that you read the 'Safety' section of the Essential Trip Information regarding special safety considerations for Egypt trips.

- The Nile felucca cruise is an amazing experience, but it's not for everyone. You will be sharing a sleeping area with your fellow group members for the night and using a shared bathroom facility on board.
- The walkways around ruins can be uneven, dusty and rocky, so be sure to bring sturdy, comfortable walking shoes. At major sites such as the pyramids, you can expect to be exposed to the elements at length, so be prepared with a hat, sunscreen and plenty of fluids.
- Some hotels in Egypt may not have elevators, so on occasion you may need to climb stairs with your luggage to reach your room.
- The temperatures in Egypt can be extreme, from very hot to very cold (it even snows in some places). Be prepared to layer up & down. The best time to visit Egypt is from September through to April. The average temperature reaches a high of 91°F during the day and dips to a low of about 68°F at night.





OUR ITINERARY:

Day 1: Cairo (1N Cairo hotel)

(Meals: D)

Arrive Cairo by 3pm today and check into the hotel (or arrive one day early). US citizens can obtain a 30-day tourist visa on arrival at the Cairo airport for \$25. Our meeting point is the Cairo hotel. Our group meeting is at 4pm in the hotel lobby. At 6pm we will depart to enjoy our group "Welcome Dinner" - including a Sufi Dance Khan al-Khalili. Cairo is one of the great ancient cities and its history can be symbolized by two imposing landmarks – the Pyramids of Giza and the Mosque of Mohammed Ali.

Optional Activities: (Payable in local currency. Prices below are approximate prices in US\$). If you arrive early take a felucca ride or explore the local markets on your own. If you want to escape the hustle and bustle, take a self-walking tour through the Christian Comic neighborhood and/or visit:

- The Citadel entry fee EGP180 (approx \$12pp).
- Coptic Museum -entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Islamic Art Museum -entry fee EGP140 (approx \$9pp).

Special Information:

It's very important that you attend the welcome meeting as we will be collecting insurance details and contact information. If you are going to be late please ask hotel reception or look for a note in the lobby for more information on where the meeting will take place. If you can't arrange a flight that will have you arrive in time for today's welcome meeting, you may wish to arrive a day early so you're able to attend. We'll be happy to book additional accommodation for you (subject to availability).

Day 2: Cairo Sightseeing & Overnight sleeper train Cairo to Aswan

(Meals: B, D)

After breakfast, we'll set out to see some of Egypt's most renowned sights. Visit Giza's famous pyramids and Sphinx exploring these structures that have stood tall for 4500 years. Option to go inside the Great Pyramid of Khufu for an additional small charge. Free afternoon (see optional

activities below). In the evening, our local guide will take us to the Giza train station, where we will board a sleeper train to Aswan (approx 13 hrs).

Included Activities: Cairo - Pyramids and Sphinx

Cairo Optional Activities:

- The Great Pyramid of Cheops entry fee EGP400 (approx \$26pp).
- The 2nd Pyramid of Khafre entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Solar Boat Museum entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Egyptian Museum, home to one of the world's great collections of antiquities (Visit with our local guide entry fee & guide fee is EGP400 (approx \$26pp). Or visit on your own entry fee EGP120 approx \$8pp). Wander the treasure-filled halls of the museum, and check out the optional Mummies Hall (entry fee EGP180 approx \$12pp) for a close encounter with some of the country's most important queens and pharaohs. Additional fee to take photos EGP50 (approx \$3.25pp).
- Saqqara and Memphis Afternoon Tour (Min 2p) Transfers/Entry/Guide EGP1100 (approx \$70pp).

Special Information

- The Great Pyramid of Khufu is occasionally closed to visitors and can be very hot in the summer months, so be prepared for little shade (bring an umbrella), pack appropriate clothing, sun protection & water, and be ready to walk.
- Charges for the optional activities listed are for entry only. Your leader may suggest group activities to visit some of the local sights, which include transport and guiding. If you prefer to do your own thing, taxis are available and your leader can assist in organizing.
- The overnight train is air-conditioned and bedding is provided. There are restrooms in each carriage but consider bringing additional toilet paper. General cleanliness of the train may vary. An included dinner and breakfast are served on board; however, you may want to stock up beforehand, particularly if you have dietary requirements.



Day 3: Aswan (2N hotel) Free Day

(Meals: B)

Arrive by train in the morning to Aswan, Egypt's southernmost city with Elephantine Island and white-sailed feluccas. Today is a free day to see such Aswan sites as the unfinished obelisk or the High Dam. The Nubian Bazaar is a must, while the excellent Nubian Museum is top of many visitors' lists. Highly recommended is the beautiful Temple of Isis (goddess of health, marriage and wisdom), which was rescued from the rising Nile waters and relocated to Philae Island. It's a marvel of decorative pylons featuring some of Egypt's finest carvings – definitely one of the real gems of Upper Egypt. The waterfront promenade, or corniche, runs alongside one of the Nile's most appealing stretches and is the perfect place to stop for a mint tea. Watch the waterfront come alive at dusk, with families out strolling, socializing and relaxing along the corniche.

Day 4: Aswan (1N hotel) (Free Day to visit Abu Simbel)

(Meals: B)

Today is an excellent opportunity to visit the stunning Abu Simbel, with the four gargantuan statues of Ramses guarding the Great Temple. This is one of Egypt's most memorable sights. Otherwise, the day is free for you to make your own discoveries. A popular afternoon option in Aswan is a sailboat ride around the islands in a traditional felucca, stopping off at the botanical gardens on Kitchener's Island. Or take a camel ride to the Monastery of St Simeon, an abandoned seventh-century fortress located in the desert on the Nile's west bank. Our local leader will be on hand to help you get the most out of your day. You may prefer to just relax and take in the beauty of the Nile, or do some shopping in the vibrant bazaar.

Aswan Optional Activities:

- Abu Simbel Tour: Group Minivan (depart 5-6am for the 3 hour drive each way)/Entrance/Guiding (Min 4p) approx \$110pp OR by air (more popular & subject to availability) approx \$320pp. We will discuss these options with our local guide at the welcome meeting day one. It's best to visit at sunrise to avoid the heat.
- Nubian Village Visit and Dinner (Min 4p) EGP225 (approx \$14pp).



Day 5: Nubian Family Homestay (1N homestay)

(Meals: B, L, D)

Morning sail on a traditional Egyptian felucca sailboat. After lunch on board the felucca, arrive at a Nubian homestay on the west bank of the Nile. Learn about the local way of life with a walk through the surrounding countryside and agriculture fields to reach the homestay. The house is in traditional Nubian style, with a sandy courtyard in the middle where the family gathers for meals, and bedrooms to the side – where we will stay for the night. Get into the swing of Egyptian life by lending a hand in the kitchen to help cook dinner, or maybe kick around a football in the courtyard with the kids. There are few better ways to understand a country and its people than with a local homestay, and you'll have the chance tonight to soak it all up.



Day 6: Nile Felucca (1N felucca boat)

(Meals: B, L, D)

Board a felucca sailboat and enjoy a day on the river, seeing rural Egyptian daily life play and spend a night under the stars. Our sailing crew will provide our onboard delicious meals. The felucca is a traditional wooden boat with broad canvas sails, offering some shade and protection from the elements, but there is no cabin or enclosed section – watching the sun setting over the Nile in the evening from an open deck is an experience you won't forget!

Included Activities: Nile - Felucca overnight sailing trip

Optional Activities: Aswan - Kom Ombo Temple -Entry Fee - EGP140 (approx \$9pp).

PLEASE NOTE: If you don't want to sleep overnight on the Felucca sailboat, there is an option of skipping DAY 6 and staying in a hotel (the Obelisk Nile Hotel). The cost is \$125 per person (including the transfer to the hotel, the hotel night, and transfer DAY 7 to Luxor to rejoin the group).

Day 7: Luxor (2N hotel)

(Meals: B)

Private van to Luxor (approx 3.5 hours) where we will explore with our local guide the magnificent Karnak Temple, perhaps the most impressive of all the ancient pharaohs monumental works, a house of the gods built over a period of some 200 years. A vast temple of impressive pylons, obelisks and chapels revealing the Avenue of Sphinxes and the Great Temple of Amun. The rest of the day will be free to relax, shop in the bazaar (open until quite late) or perhaps experience the atmosphere of a local teahouse.

Luxor Optional Activities: on-your-own entrance fee only (At the welcome meeting we can ask the cost to hire our local guide & transport to attend any activity)

- Luxor Temple entry fee EGP160 (approx \$10pp).

Day 8: Luxor

(Meals: B)

Early morning private transport to the Valley of the Kings with over 60 tombs of pharaohs buried under the arid hills, many richly decorated with reliefs and paintings. The pharaohs of the New Kingdom (16th to 11th century BC) were secretly interred for all eternity, and new discoveries are still being made. With our local guide, learn about the history and legends of these remarkable people, their funerary rites, and the significance of the many paintings and hieroglyphics, still well-preserved in the deepest tombs. Visit three of the most interesting royal tombs (camera fee EGP 300 = approx \$20) and then continue to the Temple of Queen Hatshepsut – a stunning colonnaded building set against high cliffs that create a spectacular natural amphi theatre. The legendary Hatshepsut had this mortuary temple built to signify her importance and honor her ancestors.

Included Activities: Luxor - Valley of the Kings (3 tombs) and Hatshepsut Temple **Luxor Optional Activities:** on-your-own entrance fee only (At the welcome meeting we can ask the cost to hire our local guide & transport to attend any activity)

- Tomb of Tutankhamun entry fee EGP300 (approx \$19pp).
- Dinner Local Family (Min 4p) EGP225 (approx \$14pp).
- Hot Air Balloon Valley of the Kings (USD\$120).
- Medinat Habu Temple entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Valley of the Queens -Tomb of Queen Nefertari entry fee EGP1200 (approx \$77pp).
- Valley of the Queens entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Optional hot air balloon ride over the Valley of the Kings and the temples on the west bank (subject to weather conditions). Depart hotel between 430-5am. Balloon capacity is 16–25p, cameras are prohibited in the basket (cellphones are allowed). Cost: TBD.

Day 9: Hurghada (2N hotel)

(Meals: B, D)

This morning, farewell the Nile to drive east to the beachside town of Hurghada (approximately 5 hours). The green Nile valley is soon left behind as you head out into the Eastern Desert. As you pass by rocky hills, the glittering waters of the Red Sea come into view and the rugged bulk of the Sinai Peninsula looms through the haze on the opposite shore. A vibrant beach resort, Hurghada is by no means a typical adventure destination. After checking in to your hotel, take a leader-led orientation walk to get your bearings and to scope out some of the local restaurants.

Day 10: Hurghada

(Meals: B, L, D)

Transfer to the Hurghada Marina and take a boat trip to Giftun Island, part of the Red Sea Marine Parks. Spend a relaxing day on the stunning white beach of Mahmya. Opportunity to take a snorkeling boat excursion to one of the most magnificent reefs in the Red Sea – fine reef walls, lovely fan corals and colorful fish. Snorkel gear provided. Buffet lunch in one of Mahmya's open-air restaurants overlooking the ocean, with activities such as volleyball, soccer, or relaxing on the beach. Head back to Hurghada in the late afternoon and transfer to hotel.

Included Activities: Hurghada - Mahmya Beach Cruise (Daytrip)

Day 11: Cairo (1N hotel)

(Meals: B)

Private transport (6 hours) back to Cairo. In Cairo, visit the Islamic parts of the city and the frenetic backstreets of the local Khan el-Khalili bazaar with your local guide. The 'Khan' is one of the biggest and oldest markets in the world, sprawling around an old area known as Al-Azhar, a warren of alleys with stalls serving up a succession of intoxicating scenes and a quintessentially Cairo experience. Option to visit the gold market, 'Perfume Street' and the spice market, where heady aromas hang in the air like a thick blanket of Damascene cloth (which can be purchased next door in the cloth market!).

Included Activities: Cairo - Khan al-Khalili bazaar visit

Optional Activities: Cairo - Sound & Light Show at the Pyramids (tour with transfer & entry (Min 2p) EGP700pp (approx \$45pp). or on own entrance EGP300 (approx \$19pp).

Day 12: Alexandria (2N)

(Meals: B)

Private van following the 'desert road' to the Mediterranean coastal city of Alexandria (approx 3 hours). Egypt's second largest city and main port, locals call this vibrant city the Bride of the Mediterranean Sea. On arrival, take an orientation walking tour with your local guide. The Greek architect Dinocrates built Alexandria in 331 BC under the orders of Alexander the Great. The city, immortalizing Alexander's name, quickly flourished into a prominent cultural, intellectual, political and economic metropolis. Take time to stroll along the corniche, taking in the fresh Mediterranean air. Alexandria at night is not to be missed, with the whole city lighting up.

Optional Activities - Alexandria - Qaitbay fortress - entry fee EGP60 (approx \$4pp).

Day 13: Alexandria (1N hotel)

(Meals: B, L)

Today, head back to a more recent period in Egyptian history with a visit to El Alamein and the El Alamein war museum which sits on the Mediterranean Sea, 106 kilometres west of Alexandria, playing an important role in significant World War II battles. The area was a turning

point in the North African campaign, where the Allies held out against, and eventually pushed back and defeated, the Afrika Korps of Rommel. The area contains a number of memorials from the countries who lost soldiers here – Greece, South Africa, Australia, Italy – as well as a war cemetery that's home to the graves and names of the thousands who lost their lives. In the museum, discover the story of the events that unfolded here. Return to Alexandria, well known for its seafood and fresh fish.

Included Activities: El Alamein - War Museum

Optional Activities: Alexandria - Commonwealth cemetery - Free

Day 14: Cairo (1N hotel)

(Meals: B)

This morning, head underground and delve into the mysteries of the Kom Ash Shuqqafa catacombs. This Roman burial site is the largest of its kind in Egypt and was discovered, quite accidentally, by a hapless donkey. The crypts are 20 metres below street level, and what probably began as a small family tomb grew into a labyrinth of chambers that could accommodate more than 300 bodies. Stop by the strikingly modern Bibliotheca Alexandrina, inspired by the original great library of Alexandria and built to hold over 8 million books. Afterwards, head to El Morsi Abu El Abbas Mosque, the largest in the city. During your free time, perhaps take the opportunity to see the Citadel of Qaitbay, a fortress overlooking the Mediterranean Sea, where the famous lighthouse once stood. Then leave Alexandria and return to Cairo (approx 5 hour drive), arriving around 4 pm. Free afternoon (see optional activities below). Optional evening group get-together with our travel crew for a celebratory kebab, kofta, or sheesha.

Included Activities in Alexandria: Catacombs of Kom Ash-Suqqafa, Bibliotheca Alexandrina, and Morsi Abu El Abbas Mosque.

Alexandria Optional Activities:

- Alexandria National Museum entry fee EGP100 (approx \$6.50pp).
- Roman Amphitheatre entry fee EGP80 (approx \$5pp).

It offers two trip evacuations per year, \$50,000 of medical coverage per incident, lost baggage, trip delay, etc. However, it does not offer the "cancel for any reason" add-on.
